APPROVAL OF MINUTES

MOTION by Supervisor Williams, seconded by Supervisor Santay to approve the April Board of Supervisors Meeting Minutes of April 4, 2019 and the Workshop Meeting Minutes of April 18, 2019. Motion carried, 3-0.

APPROVAL OF BILL LIST #5

MOTION by Supervisor Williams, seconded by Supervisor Santay to approve Bill List #5 General Fund Checks 35634 - 35677 totaling \$45,382.09. Motion carried, 3-0.

PRELIMINARY/FINAL PLAN

Kalathas Mini Storage – Extension Letter (PennDOT HOP) Gil Picarelli informed the Board that they changed their Ordinance that it now requires approved drawings to be recorded within ninety (90) days of approval. All Land, LLC is requesting a ninety (90) day extension of recording the drawings as PennDOT has not issued the Highway Occupancy Permit (HOP).

MOTION by Supervisor Santay, seconded by Supervisor Williams to accept the ninety (90) day extension request from All Land, LLC for the Kalathas Mini Storage Land Development plans. Motion carried, 3-0.

REPORTS

Supervisor informed everyone that the Reports are up front for review.

OLD BUSINESS

CSX – Railroad Lane – Update

Curtis MacBeth informed the Supervisors that he has no update. Supervisor Crushong would like Curt MacBeth, Roadmaster to reach out and discuss when this project will be completed.

NEW BUSINESS

Adopt a Road Program – Bernie Yannetti, Solicitor informed the Board that based on the recommendation of the Township Solicitor and the Township Insurance Company, the Township does not want to enter into any type of formal agreement or formal contract where the Township is sponsor of this type of program because it exposes the Township to Liability issues. If the Township was to lend/provide vest, trash bags, gloves to pick up stuff, the Township can do that but it is Solicitor Yannetti's and the Insurance Carrier's strong recommendation that the Township does not sponsor such a program. Ms. Gebhardt informed the Board that she did not need a contract that this was for her son as a young Marine to get service hours in. She thought this would be a good way for him to get his service hours and also to help the Township with the trash along Flohrs Church and Sunset Roads. The Township will supply trash bags, gloves, trash bags and will pick up the bags once they are filled. The Township will also sign off on the community service hours.

Resolution No. 2019-01 – Agricultural Security Area #1 - Updated

MOTION made by Supervisor Santay, seconded by Supervisor Williams to approve Resolution No. 2019-01 – Updated Agricultural Security Area #1. Motion carried, 3-0.

Resolution No. 2019-03 – Opposition of House Bill 349 – Multiple Third-Party Agencies for UCC.

MOTION made by Supervisor Williams, seconded by Supervisor Santay to approve and sign Resolution No. 2019-03 opposing House Bill 349 mandating Municipalities to hire multiple third-party agencies for Uniform Construction Code Services. Motion carried, 3-0.

Supervisor Crushong informed everyone that he and Gil Picarelli, KPI Technologies went over to 18 Edward Court before the meeting and there is no water that Supervisor Crushong could see that was coming from 18 Edward Court onto the road or on the Mr. Warrenfeltz property. There was some water coming from the School Parking lot and the adjacent lot but not from 18 Edward Court.

GUESTS

Resident Joel Riddlemoser wanted to know where the Mini Storage was going. Supervisors informed Mr. Riddlemoser that it was going near Golf Course Road off of Chambersburg Road.

Russell W. Myers, Jr., a friend of Ms. Kimberly Scalio of 18 Edward Court. He presented the Board with a statement and pictures of what Ms. Scalio sees as what is causing the water problem for her neighbor's road and fields. Ms. Scalio is aware of the issue and she is working on fixing any of these problems and has been in contact with Mr. Warrenfeltz and Ms. Fees. The water coming from the School is causing a majority of the problem. Ms. Scalio would like to have more communication on this subject with everyone involved and wanted everyone to know that she is addressing the issues.
