OLD BUSINESS

Brightspeed – No update

Susan Plank, Secretary/Treasurer informed the Board that Brightspeed called this office and they are on the Workshop Agenda to discuss other work in the Township.

Ben King – Sawmill – 385 Ragged Edge Road – Extension Request

Susan Plank, Secretary/Treasurer read a request from Mr. King for a 60-day Extension on the Violation Notice that he has received. Supervisor Williams suggested a 90-day Extension because of the weather and how wet things are.

MOTION by Supervisor Williams, seconded by Supervisor Crushong to give Mr. King a 90-day Extension to address the violation concerns with the stockpile of logs on his property. Motion carried, 3-0.

NEW BUSINESS

Corian Signs to replace the aluminum Cashtown Signs – No Cost to the Township.

Susan Plank, Secretary/Treasurer informed everyone that the Township received a letter from Mr. Jack Graham, Keystone Marker Trust asking if the Township would like two (2) cast iron signs to be replaced with Corian replicas. Gettysburg Vo-Tech is willing to make the signs at no cost to the Township and then the Township would be responsible for installing them. The Board gave their permission to have Gettysburg Vo-Tech make the signs for the Township.

Road Crew – four (4) ten-hour days – Monday through Thursday – 6:00 am to 4:00 pm – beginning March 19, 2026 through October 14, 2026 at which time the Road Crew will go back to five (5) eight (8) hour days from 6:00 pm to 2:00 pm Monday through Friday.

Supervisor Santay informed everyone that this is a yearly change in hours for the Road Crew. No need to a motion.

South Mountain Antique Engine – Tractor Drive, May 9, 2026 – 9 am to 2 pm

MOTION by Supervisor Williams, seconded by Supervisor Crushong to approve the South Mountain Antique Engine Tractor Drive on May 9, 2026 – 9 am to 2 pm. Motion carried, 3-0.

MOTION by Supervisor Williams, seconded by Supervisor Crushong to award the FB Modified in place on Crooked Creek Road Project to Russell Standard Corporation in the amount of \$315,350.00. Motion carried, 3-0.

MOTION by Supervisor Crushong, seconded by Supervisor Williams to authorize Susan Plank, Secretary/Treasurer to re-advertise for Fuel Bids and Millwork on Crooked Creek Road. Motion carried, 3-0.

There being no further comments the Board of Supervisors went into Executive Session at 7:45 pm concerning potential litigation and came out of Executive Session at 8:25 pm.


